Dr. J. "Doug" Beason has over 35 years of R&D experience conducting research, directing applied-science programs, and formulating national policy. Some of his accomplishments include: serving 24 years for the USAF before retiring as a Colonel; acting as Chief Scientist for the USAF Space Command as a Senior Level Executive; operating as the Associate Laboratory Director (Thread Reduction) and Director of Intelligence at Los Alamos National Laboratory; working as key White House staffer for defense and space under both the Clinton and Bush administrations; and serving on a Vice Presidential committee generating plans for the nation's return to the Moon and continuation on to Mars. His active duty USAF assignment was as the Commander of the Phillips Research Site and deputy director for the Directed Energy Directorate at AFRL.
